ARTICLE FIFTEEN

WATER POLO

- **15.1** In September the boys' varsity matches will start at 3:30 p.m. In October the girls' varsity will start at 3:30 p.m. At all times the varsity will play first and the Fr/Soph will follow
 - **15.1-1** Varsity contests will play seven (7) minute quarters. Fr/Soph will play five (5) minute quarters.
- **15.2** The schedule will consist of a triple round robin.
 - 15.2-1 OVERTIME: National Federation Rules will be followed.
 - **15.2-2** Schools that lose their facilities due to mechanical failure, or for any reason will move their contests to another site. If that is not possible, the contest will be played at the opposition's site. The host school will pay the official's fees.

15.3 EQUIPMENT:

- **15.3-1** The official ball will be the Kap 7 for both boys and girls.
- **15.3-2** The home team will wear dark caps and the visiting team will wear white caps. The goalie cap will be the number one (1) and may be either red or red and white quartered.
- **15.3-3** Goal lines will be marked Yellow at the five (5) yard lines and Red at the two (2) yard lines. These lines will be distinguishable to the participants, officials, and coaches.
- **15.4** Coaches will meet prior to the first league contest.
- **15.5** ALL-LEAGUE SELECTIONS: the athletic director who chairs Water Polo will chair the meeting.

- **15.5-1** All-league selections will be made within seven (7) days of the final league contest.
- **15.5-2** Seven (7) field players will be selected and one (1) goalie.
- **15.5-3** Each school may nominate four (4) players from their school. The coach may only vote for nominees of the opponents' schools. The most valuable player (MVP) will be the top vote getter.
- **15.6** LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP: Determined by the results of a triple round-robin.
- 15.7 TIE-BREAKER: See bylaw 1.24.
