Revisions to Playoff Proposal

- In soccer, tennis, baseball and soccer, we originally guaranteed each league 3 playoff spots. That has been amended to limit the league's playoff opportunities to 2, if a league fields 5 or less teams.
- Water polo was changed from a pre-determined bracket to the seeding process.

Playoff Proposal

- The Section is recommending that fall sports start one week earlier.
 - ✓ 2010-11: First day of practice – August 9
 - ✓ 2011-12: First day of practice – August 8
 - ✓ 2012-13: First day of practice – August 6
 - ✓ 2013-14: First day of practice – August 12

Playoff Proposal

- The earlier start date will allow girls golf to have a longer season and more comparable to the boys.
- Football and boys soccer playoffs will begin one week earlier. Both sports need to remain on the same schedule to avoid field usage conflicts.
- The ending dates for the other sports will not change due to NorCal and State playoff dates.

Playoff Proposal

- The following sports will receive 3 playoff spots:
- Boys and Girls Soccer
- Boys, Girls and Coed Tennis
- Baseball
- Softball

Note: A league must field at least 6 teams to receive 3 spots. If a league in any of the above sports fields five teams or less, that league will qualify only 2 teams.

Playoff Proposal

- This playoff proposal expands playoffs in many sports in an effort to keep up with growth as well as providing equity among all sports.
- This proposal allows for a seeding component for all tournaments mentioned in this document.
- This Section's philosophy has always been that playoff teams are not selected by a committee. This proposal maintains that philosophy.

- Note: The sports of cross country, tennis, golf, track and water polo are treated exactly the same for both genders.

Pre-determined Brackets

Currently, pre-determined brackets are done in the following sports:

Football, boys soccer, girls tennis, boys and girls water polo, baseball, girls soccer, softball, boys tennis and coed tennis.

The process is as follows:

- Each league is represented.
- First and second place teams are separated in opposite brackets by random draw.
- Third place teams are used to fill the bracket.
- The committee determines the rotation of third place teams.
- The fourth year brackets are determined by their performance in the playoffs in that sport during the first three years. Therefore, the two leagues with the highest winning percentage receive 3 teams.
- The brackets are approved by the Board of Managers.

Proposed Seeding Plan

The Section office is recommending the seeding of leagues in the following sports:

- Football (will be discussed later in the presentation)
- Boys soccer, boys and girls water polo, girls tennis, baseball, girls soccer, softball, boys tennis and coed tennis.

The process will be as follows:

- The Section staff will evaluate the strength of the leagues in each sport.
- The tournaments will be seeded and/or bracketed about two weeks prior to the conclusion of the sport season.
- The Section staff will attempt to seed the top four spots.
- The remaining spots will be placed. A major criteria will be to separate 1sts and 2nds from each league in the bracket.

Boys and Girls Cross Country

Current

- **Subsection:**
All-comers meet. Schools may send as many runners as they choose in several divisions.
- **Section:**
Teams and individuals qualify to the Section meet.

Proposed

- No proposed changes to the current system.

Girls Golf

Current

- **Divisionals**
Teams and individuals qualify to the divisionals through league play.
- **Masters**
Teams and individuals qualify through the divisionals. Total of 102 players.
- **NorCal and State**
Teams and individuals qualify through Masters. Total of 24 players advance to NorCal.

Proposed

- No proposed changes to the current system.

Boys Soccer

Current

Section Playoffs

- Seven divisions with teams qualifying through league competition.
- Divisions with 3 leagues all qualify 2 teams with a rotation of 3rd place teams.
- Divisions with 4 leagues all qualify 2 teams.
- All divisions have pre-determined brackets.

Boys Soccer

Proposed

Section playoffs

- Seven divisions with teams qualifying through league competition.
- Leagues in all divisions will qualify 3 teams (unless a league fields less than 6 teams).
- Divisions with 3 leagues will have a 9-team bracket. In a 9-team bracket, two 3rd place teams will play an outbracket game to get the tournament to 8 teams.
- Divisions with 4 leagues will have a 12-team bracket. In a 12-team bracket, champions will draw a bye with the 2nds and 3rds meeting in outbrackets games to get the tournament to 8 teams.
- Outbracket games will necessitate an extra round of games at the beginning of the tournament.
- In Division I, the Final Four will be cross bracketed with the 2 Norths playing the 2 Souths.
- Seeding plan will be used.

Girls Tennis

Team Tennis - Current

- Two divisions of 14-team brackets.
- Each league sends its top 2 teams to the tournament.
- The tournaments use pre-determined brackets.
- The winner of each division advances to NorCal.

Team Tennis - Proposed

- Each league will send 3 teams to their divisional tournament. If a league fields 5 or less teams, it will send only 2 teams.
- This will create brackets of up to 24 teams.
- Outbracket matches will be played between 2nd and 3rd place teams.
- Outbracket games will necessitate an extra round of games at the beginning of the tournament.
- Seeding plan will be used.
- The winner of each division advances to NorCal.
- No change for NorCal.

Girls Tennis

Individual Tennis - Current

- Each league sends its top 2 singles and top 2 doubles teams to the Section tournament.
- 2 leagues, on a rotating basis, are allowed to send 3rd place qualifiers to fill out the 16-person bracket.

Individual Tennis – Proposed

- No proposed changes to current system.
- Allowing 3 from each league would necessitate a third consecutive day of competition.

Girls Volleyball

Current

- 5 divisions based on state criteria.
- All brackets are 16 teams.
- Power rating formula utilized to select the teams.
- Staff has the authority to make adjustments to the final seeding, using criteria passed by the Board of Managers.

Proposed

- No proposed changes to the system.

Boys and Girls Water Polo

Current

- 2 divisional tournaments.
- Division I has a 16-team bracket with 6 leagues.
- Division II has a 12-team bracket with four leagues.
- All brackets are pre-determined by a water polo committee with representation from the Section staff.

Proposed

- 2 divisional tournaments.
- Both tournaments are limited to 16 teams maximum.
- Each league is guaranteed 2 teams with some leagues advancing 3 teams to fill out the 16-team bracket.
- Seeding plan will be used.
- The sport of water polo is growing, thus we are not able to determine how many leagues will exist when the new realignment cycle begins.

Winter Sports

- Basketball, boys and girls
- Wrestling, boys
- Wrestling, girls

Boys and Girls Basketball

- 5 divisions based on state criteria.
- All brackets are 16 teams.
- Power rating formula utilized to select the teams.
- Basketball committee has the authority to make adjustments to the final seeding, using criteria passed by the Board of Managers.
- No proposed changes to the system.

Boys Wrestling

Current - Team

- 5 divisional tournaments.
- In Division I, all champions qualify and one runner-up on a rotational basis to make a full 8-team bracket.
- In all other divisions, leagues send both their champion and runner-up. Brackets are either 6 teams or 8 teams based on number of leagues in the division.
- Seeding is done by a committee prior to competition.

Proposed - Team

- No proposed changes.

Boys Wrestling

Current - Individual

- 6 divisional tournaments.
- Each league qualifies 4 individuals to advance to the divisionals.
- Each divisional is either a 12- or 16-person bracket.
- Each divisional meet qualifies either 5 or 6 to the Masters Meet.
- The Masters Meet is a 32-person bracket.
- The Section qualifies 7 individuals in each of the 14 weight classes to the State Meet.

Proposed - Individual

- No proposed changes.

Girls Wrestling

Current - Individual

- The Section is attempting to implement an invitational tournament for all female wrestlers within the Section.
- The first meet will be held on February 7, 2009 at McNair High School.

Proposed - Individual

- Any changes will be made after evaluation of this year's tournament.

Badminton

Current

- Badminton is a girls only event with 4 leagues all sending 4 singles and 4 doubles to the tournament.

Proposed

- No proposed changes to the system.

Baseball

Current

Section Playoffs

- Seven divisions with teams qualifying through league competition.
- Divisions with 3 leagues all qualify 2 teams with a rotation of 3rd place teams.
- Divisions with 4 leagues all qualify 2 teams.
- There is a combination of double elimination and best 2 of 3 after the first round of play.
- Division I has a North and South bracket of 8 teams each with the winners meeting in a best 2 of 3 final.
- All divisions have pre-determined brackets.

Baseball

Proposed

Section playoffs

- Seven divisions with teams qualifying through league competition.
- Leagues in all divisions will qualify 3 teams. However, if a league fields 5 or less teams, it will qualify 2 teams.
- Divisions with 3 leagues will have a 9-team bracket. In a 9-team bracket, two 3rd place teams will play an outbracket game to get the tournament to 8 teams.
- Divisions with 4 leagues will have a 12-team bracket. In a 12-team bracket, champions will draw a bye with the 2nds and 3rds meeting in outbracket games to get the tournament to 8 teams.
- Outbracket games will necessitate an extra round of games at the beginning of the tournament. These games will be played at home sites.
- After the outbracket games are completed, the tournament will revert to the current format.
- Seeding plan will be used.

Divisionals

- Teams and individuals qualify to the divisionals through league play.

Masters

- Teams and individuals qualify through the divisionals. Total of 111 players.

NorCal and State

- Teams and individuals qualify through Masters. Total of 24 players advance to NorCal.

Proposed

- No proposed changes to the current system.

Girls Soccer

Current

Section Playoffs

- Six divisions with teams qualifying through league competition.
- Divisions with 3 leagues all qualify 2 teams with a rotation of 3rd place teams.
- Divisions with 4 leagues all qualify 2 teams.
- All divisions have pre-determined brackets.

Girls Soccer

Proposed

Section playoffs

- Six or seven divisions with teams qualifying through league competition.
- Leagues in all divisions will qualify 3 teams. However, if a league fields 5 teams or less, it will qualify 2 teams.
- Divisions with 3 leagues will have a 9-team bracket. In a 9-team bracket, two 3rd place teams will play an outbracket game to get the tournament to 8 teams.
- Divisions with 4 leagues will have a 12-team bracket. In a 12-team bracket, champions will draw a bye with the 2nds and 3rds meeting in outbracket games to get the tournament to 8 teams.
- Outbracket games will necessitate an extra round of games at the beginning of the tournament.
- In Division I, the Final Four will be cross bracketed with the 2 Norths playing the 2 Souths.
- Seeding plan will be used.

Softball

Current

Section Playoffs

- Seven divisions with teams qualifying through league competition.
- Divisions with 3 leagues all qualify 2 teams with a rotation of 3rd place teams.
- Divisions with 4 leagues all qualify 2 teams.
- Five divisions play a double elimination tournament after the first round of play.
- Two divisions play a single elimination tournament.
- All divisions have pre-determined brackets, except Division I, which is bracketed by a committee with Section representation.

Softball

Proposed

Section playoffs

- Seven divisions with teams qualifying through league competition.
- Leagues in all divisions will qualify 3 teams. However, if a league fields 5 teams or less, it will qualify 2 teams.
- Divisions with 3 leagues will have a 9-team bracket. In a 9-team bracket, two 3rd place teams will play an outbracket game to get the tournament to 8 teams.
- Divisions with 4 leagues will have a 12-team bracket. In a 12-team bracket, champions will draw a bye with the 2nds and 3rds meeting in outbracket games to get the tournament to 8 teams.
- Outbracket games will necessitate an extra round of games at the beginning of the tournament. These games will be played at home sites.
- After the outbracket games are completed, the tournament will revert to the current format.
- Seeding plan will be used.

Swimming and Diving

Current

Swimming:

- All qualifying to the Section tournament is based on meeting a qualifying time.

Diving:

- Qualifying is at the discretion of each high school program.
- For both swimming and diving, there are trials and finals.

Proposed

- No proposed changes to the current system.

Boys Tennis

Team Tennis - Current

- Two divisions of 14-team brackets.
- Each league sends its top 2 teams to the tournament.
- The tournaments use pre-determined brackets.
- The winner of each division advances to NorCal.

Team Tennis - Proposed

- Each league will send 3 teams to their divisional tournament. However, if a league fields 5 teams or less, it will qualify 2 teams.
- This will create brackets of up to 24 teams.
- Outbracket matches will be played between 2nd and 3rd place teams.

Coed Tennis

Team Tennis - Current

- One 12-team bracket.
- Each league sends its top 2 teams to the tournament.
- The tournaments use pre-determined brackets.

Team Tennis - Proposed

- Each league will send 3 teams to the tournament. However, if a league fields 5 teams or less, it will qualify 2 teams.
- This will create a bracket of up to 18 teams.
- Outbracket matches will be played between 2nd and 3rd place teams.
- Outbracket games will necessitate an extra round of games at the beginning of the tournament.
- Seeding plan will be used.

Coed Tennis

Individual Tennis - Current

- Each league sends its top 2 qualifiers in boys and girls singles, boys and girls doubles and mixed doubles.

Individual Tennis – Proposed

- No proposed changes to current system.

Track and Field

Current

- 3 divisional meets.
- Each league qualifies a set number of individuals in each event to the divisional meet.
- A set number of individuals advance from the divisional meets to the Masters.
- Additional qualifiers may advance if they attain the at-large mark at both league and divisional competition.
- The Section qualifies 3 to State in each event plus anyone who attains the State's at-large mark.
- A track committee reviews the number of qualifiers from each league.

Proposed

- No proposed changes.

Boys Volleyball

Current

- One 21-team tournament.
- Currently, 7 leagues participate.
- Each league qualifies 3 to the tournament.

Proposed

- Each league will qualify 3 teams. However, if a league fields 5 teams or less, it will qualify 2 teams.
- If more leagues begin to offer boys volleyball, the tournament would be split into two divisions.

Revisions to Original Proposal

(Approved by the Playoff Committee)

- Eliminate the separation between Divisions 2 and 3
- All 20 leagues automatically qualify their league champion and runner-up. (Total of 40)
- The remaining 24 schools are selected through the proposed process of total number of wins, head-to-head competition, combined wins of all opponents, etc.
- A school may only compete in one division lower than their league placement, but will compete in a higher division if their CBEDS numbers places them in a certain division. (For example, if School A were in a Division II league, the lowest division that they can compete in would be Division III. They would compete in Division I or II if their CBEDS number places them there.)

Revisions to Original Proposal

- After the 64 schools are selected, they are divided in four divisions of 16. A school that is misplaced due to the above criteria would be placed in their respective division and the Section staff would adjust the brackets accordingly.
- Division 4 would be divided into two brackets of 8 to compensate for the difference in school size in that respective division. Division 4A would include the 8 largest schools in Division 4 and Division 4B would include the remaining 8 schools. Each bracket would be seeded utilizing the criteria in the power point presentation. The Division 4 championship game would be played by the winners of Division 4A and 4B. There are no awards given to the winners of Division 4A and 4B.
- There are no recommended changes in Division 5 and 6.

Overview

- The current structure of pre-determined brackets for football is basically not working.
- We have had some schools in the past couple of years with outstanding records who did not make the playoffs. Examples include Rocklin (8-2) and Roseville (8-2) in 2007; Manteca (8-2) and Turlock (8-2) in 2008.
- This past year, we had a 2-8 team and a 3-7 team make the playoffs.
- Our current playoff structure is based largely on geographic location of schools for most divisions.
- Currently, each league gets two spots, and, where necessary, thirds are added to fill out the bracket.

Overview

- A major problem with pre-determined brackets is that many times the perceived two best teams are not in opposite brackets.
- This seems to be occurring more frequently in the last three years.
- The Section staff believes there is a need to expand the football brackets, so that the number of entries is comparable to other sports.
- The new plan incorporates the following: expansion of football brackets; automatic entries for first and second place teams; a new system of determining at-large entries; and a method to seed the entrants. Some components of the plan are utilized in the state of Illinois.

The Plan

- There will be four brackets of 16 teams and two brackets of 6 teams (76 total teams).
- Divisions I-IV will be 16-team brackets.
- Divisions V-VI will be 6-team brackets.

Makeup of Divisions

- Divisions I-IV will be comprised of teams from the following 20 leagues: DRL, DVC, MEL, CCC, MMC, SJAA, TCAL, CVC, Metro, SFL, CAL, PVL, SCAC, TCC, SVC, VOL, WAC, GEL, MLL and TVL.
- Divisions V and VI will be comprised of teams from the following 4 leagues: New League, SL, SMAL and HCL.

Selection of Teams

Divisions I-IV

- There are 40 automatic qualifiers.
 - ✓ The 20 league champions and the 20 runners-up.
- There are 24 at-large qualifiers.

Selection of Teams

Divisions V and VI

- There are 8 automatic qualifiers.
 - ✓ The 4 league champions and the 4 runners-up.
- There are 4 at-large qualifiers.

Determining At-Large Qualifiers

All Divisions

- At-large teams will be selected solely on the basis of regular season victories.
 - ✓ However, a team must win at least two leagues games to be considered.
- If 4 or less teams are tied for the final spot(s) and all played each other, the 13-point system will be used.
- If 5 or more teams are tied for the final spot(s) or 4 or less (that did not play each other) are tied, the following will be used to break the ties:
 - ✓ Combined wins of all opponents

If 2 Teams are Tied for Last Spot

- 1 – Head-to-head (if the two played each other) will break the tie.
- 2 – Combined wins of all defeated opponents.
- 3 – If all of the above do not eliminate all ties, Calpreps rankings (as compiled at the time of the seeding process) will be used.

Note: This is used if both teams had the same number of wins and the combined wins of all opponents were the same.

If 3 or More Teams are Tied for the Remaining Spots

- 1 – Head-to-head (if all played each other) will break the tie.
- 2 – Combined wins of all defeated opponents.
- 3 – If at any point in time, there are two teams vying for the last spot, we revert back to the previous slide (If 2 Teams are Tied for the Last Spot).
- 4 – If all of the above do not eliminate all ties, Calpreps rankings (as compiled at the time of the seeding process) will be used.

Note: This is used if all teams had the same number of wins and the combined wins of all opponents were the same.

Determining Divisions

Divisions I-IV

- 64 qualifiers have been determined (40 automatic qualifiers plus the 24 at-large teams).
- The largest 16 schools (based on the previous year's CBEDS enrollment) will be placed in Division I.
- The next 16 schools will be Division II.
- The third group of 16 schools will be Division III.
- The final 16 schools will be Division IV.

Determining Divisions

Division IV

- Division IV will be divided into two brackets of 8 based on enrollment.
- The 8 largest will be IV-A.
- The remaining 8 will be IV-B.
- The Division IV Championship Game will pit the winners of IV-A and IV-B.
- There are no awards given to the winners of IV-A and IV-B.

Determining Divisions

Divisions V and VI

- 12 qualifiers have been determined (8 automatic qualifiers plus the 4 at-large teams).
- The largest 6 schools (based on the previous year's CBEDS enrollment) will be placed in Division V.
- The remaining 6 schools will be Division VI.

Seeding the Tournament

- Schools will be listed in order by number of wins, regardless of league finish (i.e., Granite Bay/Roseville).
- If two or more teams are tied for a particular seed, the following criteria are applied, in this order:
 - 1 – Head-to-head (if exactly two teams are tied)
 - 2 – League standing
 - 3 – Combined wins of all opponents
 - 4 – Calpreps rankings

Bracketing the Tournament

- After all teams are listed 1 to 16 (1 to 6 in Divisions V and VI), the Section staff may move teams in the bracket utilizing the following criteria:
 - ✓ Move a team two spots maximum up or down within the lower half of the tournament bracket to separate first round opponents from the same league.
 - ✓ Move a team two spots maximum up or down within the tournament bracket to correct a serious injustice in the seeding.
 - ✓ If two teams from the same league are in the upper half of the tournament bracket, the Section staff may move the lower of the two teams one spot up or down to separate the two teams into opposite brackets to correct a serious seeding injustice.
 - ✓ In the first round only, if an outright league champion is seeded in the bottom half of the bracket, it will host if its opponent is not a league champion or co-champion.
 - ✓ If travel exceeds 150 miles roundtrip in any first-round games involving 1 vs. 16, 2 vs. 15, 3 vs. 14 or 4 vs. 13, the Section staff has the authority to move teams 13 through 16 to relieve the travel burden.

Selection Review

Process for Divisions I-IV

- 1 – Pick the 40 automatic qualifiers
 - For Divisions V-VI, pick 8 automatic qualifiers
- 2 – Pick the 24 at-large qualifiers
 - For Divisions V-VI, pick 4 at-large qualifiers
 - ✓ Note: An asterisk denotes one of the automatic qualifiers
 - ✓ Note: A double asterisk denotes a team that did not qualify due to combined wins of all opponents.
- 3 - Determine the divisions by enrollment
- 4 – Seed the tournament
- 5 – Bracket the tournament

Schedule (11 weeks to play 10)

For 2010-11:

- August 9 – Football practice begins on August 9 (Week 6 of NFHS calendar)
- August 11 – First day of official practice in football pads.
 - *Note: Those schools playing a zero week game, must be in pads on this day. Others may start in pads as late as August 16.*
- August 21 and 26-28 – A school may have up to a maximum of 2 scrimmages. However, a school playing a zero week game, may only scrimmage on August 21.
- August 21 – First date of official scrimmage. Student must have practiced in pads every day since August 11. (Bylaw 1902)
- August 26 -- First day for scrimmages for those starting with pads between August 12 and August 16.
- August 27 – The date a school may play a zero week game.
- September 3 – Week one of the 10-week football season.
- November 5 – Final weekend of regular season.
- November 6 – If a team plays a game on this Saturday, they must start the varsity contest no later than 1:00 p.m. This is necessary for the Section staff to compile all results and release the brackets.
 - *Note: For a school playing a zero week game, there are no restrictions during their bye week.*

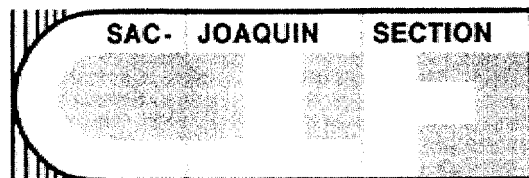

PROPOSAL FOR DIVISIONAL PLACEMENT FOR GIRLS VOLLEYBALL, CROSS COUNTRY AND BASKETBALL

- 1-Schools will be placed in a division based on enrollment. For the current year, the previous year's CBEDS enrollment will be used.
- 2-The Board of Mangers will establish divisional enrollment ranges.
- 3-If a school is placed in a division that is one division below where it is placed through realignment, that school may petition to play in the higher division or it may stay in the lower of the two divisions. (For example, a school is placed in Division III by enrollment, but plays in a Division II league. That school may choose to remain in Division III or opt to play in Division II.)
- 4-If a school is placed in a division that is two divisions below where it is placed through realignment, that school must move up at least one division. Or, it may choose to play in the division it was placed in through realignment. In this case, a school is not allowed to remain in its CBEDS enrollment division. (For example, a school is placed in Division III by enrollment, but plays in a Division I league. That school may choose to play in Divisions I or II. It cannot remain in Division III).
- 5-A school is not allowed to play in a division lower than its CBEDS enrollment places it.
- 6-Each sport – girls volleyball, girls cross country, boys cross country, girls basketball and boys basketball – will be treated independently of each other.
- 7-All schools affected by this plan (currently, 23 schools) must choose their appropriate divisions for each sport annually by September 15. If an affected school does not submit a form, it will be placed in the highest division possible.
- 8-The Section office will prepare an official form.
